

Congratulations **Rhonda Guthrie** on being awarded the Montagu Trophy for 2024 for services to the veteran car community.

Rhonda has been a member of the Queensland club all her adult life after her courtship and marriage to husband, Ross Guthrie. The Guthrie family were well known in the Veteran Car Club almost since its inception, having owned and restored numerous vehicles in their panel beating business.

It wasn't until the late 1990's that Rhonda started to take a more active role in the Club when she took on the role of Member Liaison, a position she holds to this very day. In her own words she says, "I love this Club and I just want to make sure our members can make the most of their association with it".

Member Liaison Role

New Members - Once we have contact with a prospective member, Rhonda makes contact to help them with their application. Once received she organises the printing of the name badge and sends out the Welcome Pack with all the relevant information. At their first meeting or event she will meet them and introduce them to various members and make sure they feel included.

Sourcing vehicles - They don't currently have a veteran, no problem, Rhonda will find out what sort of vehicle they are looking for and then use her national network to find suitable candidates. Most new Associate Members are Full Members before the end of their first year of membership.

Merchandise - Rhonda also makes sure that members are kitted out appropriately with club merchandise by managing stock levels, pricing and promotion of sales.

Attendance at events – Rhonda is always on the lookout for local and interstate events which may be of interest to our members. She will contact the organisers for more information and if appropriate will send out information to local and country members. She is very diligent in ensuring that our country members are not forgotten when it comes to information. It is largely through her efforts that our Queensland events have had excellent attendance in recent years and that our Queensland contingent at National Events has been so strong.

Registrar

Membership Records - Along with Liaison, Rhonda has been keeper of the Membership records for Queensland. It is from these records that the information for the National Directory is derived. As this is only printed every 5 years, she also distributes Queensland membership listings on a more regular basis.

Dating Records - When her husband took on the Dating Committee chairmanship, Rhonda took on the role of Secretary to the committee. This involved the compiling of historic dating records as well as maintaining an upto-date listing. From that she was also able to manage the issuing of **100 year badges** for Queensland with the keeping of appropriate records.

Anniversary Books

At the end of each decade for the last two, Rhonda has produced an Anniversary Book to review the events of the previous 10 years and showcase the vehicles owned by our members. The 50th Anniversary Book in 2006 was a 57 page publication followed in 2016 with a 100 page publication to mark the 60th Anniversary.

Clubrooms

Consumables supply – Each time Rhonda attends the club rooms, usually 3 times per month, she checks the cleanliness, replenishes paper towel and toilet roll dispensers, collects tea towels for washing and checks reorder levels of cleaning materials.

Locking up – Even though they have further to travel to meetings than most members, Ross and Rhonda are usually the last to leave after vacuuming the auditorium and sweeping and cleaning duties in the kitchen and final checks before locking up.

Rhonda has been responsible for organising in part or in full, many events over the years.

Committee Positions.

Most of this work being carried out as an ordinary member of the Club. It wasn't until 2007 that she succumbed to pressure and nominated for committee, being duly elected that year.

Secretary – 2015 to 2018 Rhonda accepted the position of Secretary as well as fulfilling the non/committee roles listed above.

Committee Member - Being forced to stand down after 3 years in accordance with the club rules, in 2019 to 2021 Rhonda returned as a committee member still performing those previous duties.

Secretary – Again in 2021 Rhonda accepted the Secretary's position for 12 months.

Events Director - In 2022 she returned as Rally Director until retiring at the AGM in 2024.




We jumped in the modern and headed to the lunch stop and got to see \mbox{t} there were some really lovely and interesting cars.

The following article on Denis Martin's Darracq written by reporter Jesse appeared in "The Lockyer and Somerset Independent" of 21 November last, during the Creepy Crawly Rally.


French Cars Rich Ties to Laidley and Ipswich

In late 1907, two French Darracq automobiles arrived off a boat in Brisbane and would soon be owned by some of Laidley and Ipswich's most influential figures.

The identical two-seater Darracq models had arrived from Antwerp, Belgium, and would find themselves in the hands of Laidley's first motorist and Queensland's first female graduate to study medicine.

In November 1907, Dr Valentine Mc Dowell from Laidley would purchase the Darracq and become the town's first registered motorist. Dr Mc Dowell had a practice in Laidley and was recognised by locals to drive the Darracq and later an English Talbot. The doctor was also an amateur inventor who built a successful X-ray machine in the shed at the back of Spiker Street, Laidley.

It is unknown what happened to Dr McDowell's Darracq, but its sister car, which was previously owned by Ipswich Doctor Eleanor Greenham, is now owned by Veteran Car Club of Australia Queensland member Denis Martin.





Mr Martin said he had owned Doctor Greenham's Darracq since 2012 and had a fascinating history before arriving in his hands. "Dr Greenham was the first pupil to be enrolled at Ipswich Girls' Grammar School and went on to become the first Queensland-born woman to graduate in medicine," he said. "She used the car all around Brisbane for a couple of years, but being a lady, it was a bit difficult for her to crank it. "In 1912, when a car called the Hupmobile came on the market, it had an electric self-starter, so she was able to manage that a lot better and purchased it."

Mr Martin said a Warwick man then owned the Darracq for half a century before being sought out by the Veteran Car Club of Queensland. "When this veteran car club movement started in the 1950's, a man living in Toowoomba found the Darracq outside this property outside Warwick," he said. "He dragged it back to Toowoomba and did it up. "That was the story of most of these old cars; nobody wanted them when they were 50 plus years old; most of them went to the wreckers for scrap merchants, and they scrapped them for brass to use for bullets for both World Wars. "The man in Toowoomba owned it for 50 years, and when he got old and couldn't look after it, I was lucky to come across it in the year 2012."
