SOUTHSIDE RALLY REPORT FOR FEBRUARY 2025

The Southside Rally Group kicked the New Year off with a bang on Wednesday the 19th of February with a great social day out. We visited the Beenleigh Historical Village and Museum for morning tea. It is quite an interesting display of the development of the Beenleigh area of southeast Queensland. Most of this area was settled by German immigrants who heard about the land and the available farming opportunities along the river valleys of the Albert and the Logan Rivers.

While these river flats were largely undeveloped, the land was very fertile and had great potential for farming. Upon the arrival of these new settlers in the mid-1800s they had first to have the land cleared and prepared for farming.

As there was no heavy machinery available in those days to perform this task, all the clearing had to be done by hand and backbreaking work by all able-bodied persons who settled this area. Once the land was cleared, they first attempted to grow cotton. This venture proved to be unsuccessful as the bugs destroyed the cotton. As a result, they then turned their hands to producing cattle, corn, and various other crops before settling on sugar cane which ultimately proved successful and is still grown in the area today.

The area known as Beenleigh today was named by these early settlers and remains a very successful sugar-cane growing area today. Beenleigh celebrates its sugar heritage each year with the Sugar-Cane Festival held mid-year.

Our group of 20 VCCAQ members spent several hours at the Historic village after enjoying morning tea with freshly baked scones, jam, and cream.

As lunchtime was fast approaching it was time to gather up all our members and move on to our next venue for lunch at the Beenleigh Artisan Distillery.

While a few of our number had other appointments this afternoon, we still had 18 members attend the distillery for a very enjoyable lunch in a very pleasant setting at this oldest continuously operating distillery in Australia today.

Social interaction continued over lunch with good food and a few drinks until it was time for us to depart for our respective homes.
