Meetings commence at 7.30 pm, and Visitors are always welcome.



It was 1968. Alison and I had bought our first vintage car, a 1928 Model A Ford. Early Veteran Car Club member Ray Allan noticed the sawn-off horn trumpet on our car and said he had a spare we were welcome to.

On our visit to collect the trumpet, Ray introduced us to his wife, Peggy. Peggy was English and quite ladylike. She said to Alison, "you are new to this old car business. You need to get a cape to wear. One that comes down below your knees," and proceeded to explain her reasoning.

She and Ray had just returned from the 1968 Apex Queen's Birthday Rally at Hervey Bay. Trailering cars to rallies back then was largely unheard of. Ray and Peggy set off from Hendra at daybreak in their 1906 Reo twin cylinder roadster, driving for Hervey Bay. All went well for the first couple of hours, when Peggy said "Ray, I need a pee." Ray urged her to hang on until he had to stop for fuel. Twenty minutes later, after bouncing along the rough old Bruce Highway, "Ray, I really DO need a pee." Ray showed little feel for Peggy's situation and said he didn't want to lose time, and it wouldn't be long until he had to stop for fuel anyway.

Then, the muffler fell off the Reo and Ray was forced to pull over to fix it. Peggy told Alison that "I walked to the footpath, spread my cape around me and had a welcome kangaroo, while waving to passing traffic." Alison never did get a cape.

As we mark Australia Day on 26 January it is an appropriate time to celebrate all things Australian.





AUSTRALIAN VEHICLES

THE SHEARER STEAM MOTOR CAR 1898 – 1900

Ten years before Henry Ford in America had built his automobile, David Shearer, at Mannum, had built a steam car with the world's first differential. The restored car is now on permanent display at the National Motor Museum in Birdwood, SA.

Extract from 'The Mail' Saturday 10 July 1926

Australia's First Motor Car – Mannum Manufacturer's Invention

"Well known in South Australia as a manufacturer of farm implements, Mr David Shearer, of Mannum, River Murray, can claim to be Australia's first inventor of a motor car.

In the early nineties he designed and built a power-propelled vehicle, which, a few years later astonished all Adelaide as it chugged its way through the streets at 15 miles an hour. Special permission from the Mayor had to be obtained before the car could be driven through the streets... "but" says Mr Shearer, "the horses were not used to it and much profanity was directed at my head by the drivers of horse drawn vehicles".

1904 OHLMEYER

C.H.P. OHLMEYER (Tanunda, S.A. The Ohlmeyer "Jigger" has a single-cylinder water cooled engine, two forward speeds but no reverse and is chain driven to each back wheel. There are no springs and the seat was 'borrowed' from a horse-drawn buggy. It was used in the Tanunda district for a number of years and was restored in the 60's. The photo (from State Library of SA) shows Albert's two sons, Julien and Ernst in the vehicle.



1898 THOMSON


Herbert Thomson was the first successful manufacturer of motor vehicles in Australia. His first car, a steamer built in 1898, made the first interstate trip in Australia by motor car when it was driven from Bathurst to Melbourne during April-May 1900. The first Thomson Steamer is displayed in the Science Museum Melbourne.






THE SOUTHERN CROSS

Built in the early 1930's by Marks Motors Construction Ltd Newtown. This was a development of the Marks Moir Car (early 20's), of stressed plywood construction. The engine was Australian-built. The Tourer was christened by Lady Kingsford-Smith on 2 June 1933.




Kingsford-Smith with his fellow Directors, the Fokker monoplane of the same name in the background.

Modifications were made to the next car, the Airline Sedan, released early in 1934. The car was driven to Melbourne by Smithy, Marks and Nielsen and performed well but due to the high cost did not continue in production.



HOLDEN – 'AUSTRALIA'S OWN CAR'

Background

In 1917 the Holden and Frost partnership began building bodies for Dodge chassis, when Government regulations prohibited importation of fully assembled cars. In that year around 25 hand-tailored bodies were produced. By 1912 the company, now known as Holden's Motor Body Builders Ltd was turning out 6,000 bodies a year and fitting them to a variety of makes of cars. They continued to expand and became the leading body-builders in Australia.

In 1930 a new company, General Motors – Holden's was formed and took over assembling GM products in Australia.

Following the Second World War the Federal Government called for submission from companies interested in building an Australian car and in 1946 General Motors – Holden's proposal was accepted. In 1948 the first Holden rolled off the assembly line.

SOME AUSTRALIAN INVENTIONS

Black box flight recorder



A Flight Data Recorder (FDR). *Image credit: Australian Transport Safety Bureau* The black box flight recorder has helped make commercial air travel the world's safest form of travel. It was invented by Australian scientist Dr David Warren, who lost his own father to an aircraft tragedy in 1934 when the *Miss Hobart* crashed into the Bass Strait. This remarkable device is virtually indestructible and records the final moments of a crashed plane's last flight. While it is a box, it's not black – it's bright orange colour is called 'international orange', making it easier to find in crash-site rubble.

David Warren first had the black box idea in the 1950s when he was part of a Melbourne research team exploring why the commercial jet aircraft known as the Comet had suffered a series of deadly crashes. He thought it would help investigators fix what was wrong if they had a recording of the last conversations between crew and other sounds inside the plane before it crashed. A black box is now installed on every commercial plane around the world, but it was in Australia that they were first made compulsory for all commercial flights.



Electronic pacemaker

Australian doctor **Mark Lidwill** and physicist **Edgar Booth** developed the first artificial pacemaker in the 1920s. Now, more than three million people worldwide rely on pacemakers to keep their hearts beating properly.

Artificial pacemakers send small electric charges into the heart to help it maintain a regular beat. Since the late 1960s, these have been implanted inside the body; Lidwill used the invention in 1928 to revive a stillborn baby – small pulses of electricity were sent through a needle directly into the child's heart. After 10 minutes, the equipment was switched off, the heart continued to beat and the infant made a full recovery.


