
Laidley's First Motorist

In 1907 Dr Valentine Mc Dowell purchased a practice in Laidley and began providing care to the citizens of Laidley. At the end of 1907 he purchased his first car and became Laidley's first motorist.

Late in November Dr Mc Dowell travelled to Brisbane and purchased a French 2cyl Darracq 8/10hp two-seater which was one of two identical cars that had just arrived by boat. The car was purchased through the Canada Cycle and Motor Company (CCM) who provided agency sales for a number of car manufacturers. The other Darracq was sold to Dr Eleanor Greenham of Ipswich who was the first Queensland born woman to practice medicine in the State.

The following account is in print of Dr McDowell's first drive: - "Leaving Brisbane shortly before three o'clock on the afternoon of 27^{th} November in his new car, the Doctor , accompanied by Alf Ridley of the CCM, braved the goat tracks that led to Laidley at that time. With a half hour stopover in Ipswich along the way, the intrepid pair made the journey over the range and arrived safely at 8pm. This was considered an excellent time!"

The good people of Laidley had hardly recovered from the shock and wonder of this noisy self-propelled vehicle when the good doctor was seen being driven on his rounds in a 4 cyl De Dion Bouton and some years later a lovely English Talbot. All this before World War 1.



Dr McDowell was an amateur inventor and in collaboration with Ernest Wyman he built a successful Xray machine in the shed at the back of Ernest's house in Spicer Street where the government offices now stand. My parents Bill and Lou Blake owned this beautiful house and we grew up there until the Government compulsorily acquired it to build new government offices.

Nothing is known of what happened to Dr McDowells Darracq but Dr Greenham's identical car still exists in its original state with VCCAQ member Denis Martin.



Fred Smith was Laidley's first mechanic and also agent for the CCM. Even before the first car owner in Laidley, Fred's assistant, Bill Fulton was getting around on a single cylinder Peugeot motorcycle belonging to Fred.

The photos attached show Dr Greenham in her Darracq identical to Dr McDowells and a later photo of Dr McDowell and his wife and chauffer in his later model Talbot.

Again calls went back and forth and Greg's assessment was that though the owner was not fond of polishing brass, the Talbot was a sound car......and so, a deposit was paid, and the Hollingums went on their merry way.

On their return, Brett, Joyce and I set off, with from memory, our trailer, to inspect and eventually, bring home the Talbot. Then followed the usual crawling over the car, the producing of spare bits and pieces, the test drive up the road – and Brett bought the car!





Now here's where the ruination of the Hollingum's lives really gets going: Brett and Christine had a lovely home in Mount Ommaney! But was it suitable for our hobby? Was the garage big enough? No, to all that, and in no time Brett and Christine purchased a lovely home at Forestdale -huge backyard – plenty of shed space – cute little granny flat – swimming pool - but a bugger of a place to get a covered trailer into the backyard.
