"Passengers The pleasure is mine When you alight Don't slam the doors",


But the other one was more personal, just: "Shut up, who the hell is driving this car?"

10-14 July 2017 National Brush Rally based in Dalby

The inaugural Brush National Rally was held last year in Wedderburn, Victoria. This year, the second National Brush Rally is centred in Dalby. The Brush motor cars were built in Detroit, USA from 1907 to 1912 and are quite rare, being a single cylinder only. There are an estimated 220 of these vehicles still existing world-wide, of which 22 are in Australia. From 10 to 14 July, these motor cars will tour around Dalby district roads, visiting Ningana Nursing Home, Bell State Primary School and other places of interest. Incidentally, A Brush car was the first motorised vehicle to cross Australia from West to East, 105 years ago. The journey was undertaken by a lone Brush, Syd Ferguson driver, Francis Birtles navigator and Rex, a cattle dog. Several of the Brushes that will be seen undertook a centenary re-enactment of the original crossing in 2012 taking just 23 days.

This vehicle was imported from the States a few years ago. The wheels, carriage and hood were restored and it was powered by a small Briggs and Stratton type engine. It has not been started in years. What true engine parts we received in boxes had suffered a major Chernobyl. From these parts Barry had parts cast brand new. Sadly all plans of how it goes together passed away with him

*** 1907 EARLY MODEL B BRUSH.

This vehicle has been classed as the most original around. It was the proverbial barn find. Again purchased from America it was in its original state. Along with this vehicle go all the records belonging with it. When we received it we had the engine running within 15 minutes of unloading it from the container. As far as we can ascertain it has the only known original Brush carbie on it. We had to replace the firewall and one chassis rail from where the barn strut had rested on it for decades. We then just painted it leaving imperfections / age on the guards and elsewhere. The seat upholstery had to be replaced as it was surrendered to Customs on

importation. This is why we have always stated that it was repaired, but not restored painted . Now unfortunately it needs more repair work.

Two years ago we noticed something wrong and called in the experts Our vehicle though sprayed and fumigated on export and import had exotic termites. So now the piano body needs Replacing. Chassis, seat, axles, wheels are all good.
